



Young Musician Concerto Competition

Competition Rules

The Competition

The annual WMSO Young Musician Concerto Competition takes place in October. On the basis of videos submitted, eight competitors will be chosen to perform live before a panel of judges at the Competition Final in October.

The winner will receive a cash prize of £1,000, a trophy presented by a renowned professional musician and the opportunity to perform a concerto with the Windsor & Maidenhead Symphony Orchestra during the following season.

The player placed in second position will receive a cash prize of £250.

Who may apply

1. The competition is open to players of piano, string, woodwind or brass instruments resident or studying in the UK or in one of the twin towns of the Royal Borough of Windsor and Maidenhead.
2. Applicants should have reached the equivalent of Grade 8 standard or higher. All applications must be accompanied by a recommendation from a teacher or professional musician.
3. Applicants should be aged 19 years or under on the date of the Competition Final.

The application process

4. Applicants are required to submit the following by 31 May:
 - a) a 10-minute video of their playing, that demonstrates their ability to perform a concerto
 - b) a summary of their musical background (CV), maximum 100 words
 - c) a completed application form
 - d) £50 entry fee. This is non-refundable.
5. Applicants may perform one work or two short contrasting pieces on the video submission. These work(s) may be repeated in the live Final in October, alternatively another work may be performed there.
6. Applicants must be available to play in the Competition Final in October.
7. Applicants will be informed by 31 July whether they are one of the eight finalists selected to perform in the Competition Final. Finalists will be told their allotted performance time by mid-September. Those not selected to perform in the Final will receive a written report on their video performance from one of the Competition judges.

Performance in the Final of the Competition

8. A panel of professional musicians will judge the competitors' performances. Their decision is non-negotiable. The award of the prize to the winner will be made on the basis of the competitor's performance on the day of the Final.
9. An extract from a concerto must be performed in the Final. A maximum duration of 15 minutes will be allocated for each competitor.
10. Competitors may perform unaccompanied in the Final. Those requiring accompaniment must provide their own accompanist. Pre-recorded accompaniment will not be accepted.
11. Competitors must arrive a minimum of 30 minutes before their allocated performance time and must be in attendance for the announcement of the result of the Competition.
12. Competitors must provide a copy of their music for the use of the adjudicators during their performance.
13. All finalists will receive a sheet of adjudicators' comments at the end of the competition.
14. The organisers will take photographs of the competitors to be used on the orchestra's website, publicity and social media. For players under 18, the signature of a parent or guardian is required on the application form, to give consent. For players over 18, signing of the application form includes permission for photographs to be used.
15. For the winner, the date of the performance and choice of concerto will be agreed in discussion with the Music Director of the orchestra after the Final day.
16. Failure to comply with any of these Competition Rules will disqualify the applicant.
